2. Title of Lesson

Expectation(s) (Directly from The Ontario Curriculum):

D2. Immigration and Cultural Diversity: describe the diversity of Canada's population, and assess some social, economic, political, and environmental implications of immigration and diversity for Canada

3. Purpose-BIG IDEA

"Why do immigrants settle in a particular location?"

"Should governments attempt to control where immigrants settle in Canada?"

"Why are workers from other countries sometimes brought into Canada on a temporary basis instead of being allowed to enter as immigrants?"

"What types of incentives might companies and/or governments offer to encourage people to settle in a particular location?"

4. Learning Outcomes

Write purposeful information texts that express ideas and information to

- explore and respond
- record and describe
- analyze and explain
- persuade
- engage

5. Teaching/Learning Strategies

HOOK

- Display the array of posters available in the materials section on a smart board and ask the students to decode what they notice in the posters
- Gear them towards, how they are all Caucasians, men and wearing European

inspired clothing

• Historically Canada has opened up their gates for many different cultures such as Irish, Polish, Swedish etc. However, they did not appeal to Sikhs for their contribution.

LESSON SEQUENCE

- April is Sikh Heritage month-
- Students are asked create a poster calling all Sikhs to certain geographic areas that will coincide with their skill sets. Show them the pictures of early Sikhs in Canada and where they worked.
- Refer to the power point provided on the website titled "Where are you from?"


